The first general primary election ever held in Webster county was held Tuesday of this week and proved a very satisfactory way of choosing the nominees of the various parties, but the voter had to use extreme caution in making out his ticket. There were five tickets and on the Democratic and Republican tickets there were from two to a half dozen candidates for many of the offices. The count in Oark township was not completed until nearly daylight Wednesday morning. The vote below, while not being official, is believed to be absolutely correct. For the office of sheriff and assessor on the Democratic ticket the vote was very close, Walker Day for sheriff receiving six majority over Joe Foster, his closest competitor, while John Compton received four more votes than Joe Clifton, his nearest competitor. Nearly three-fourths of the entire vote of the county was cast, and as far as we have heard, the election passed off peacefully and quiet, no disturbances being reported from any of the precincts. Below is the total vote received by the candidates on the Democratic and Republican tickets:
