

Election Tuesday. NO Excitement!

BECKER RECEIVES UNUSUAL MAJORITY

Mills, Poynor, Bruton, Davis, Shelton, Republican winners, while Mrs. McMahan, Henderson and Highfill Receive Democrat Preference.

A larger number of Republicans voted in the Primary election Tuesday than usual while about the normal Democratic primary vote was cast. The Republican primary vote was about 2300 and the Democratic vote about 1100.

In the contests on the County Republican ticket H. P. Bruton won the nomination for Judge of the Western District; John M. Poynor received the nomination for Sheriff; W. R. Davis won a close contest for nomination for Assessor; Josephine Shelton was nominated for Treasurer; Edwin W. Mills for Prosecuting Attorney, and Benj. Ward has apparently secured the nomination for Surveyor.

In Ozark township Chas. Martin secured the nomination for Constable by a vote of 280 to 144 for J. H. Muse.

In the Democratic primary Mrs. Eva McMahan defeated W. W. Limbaugh for Representative; John H. Henderson won the nomination for Sheriff over John McDaniel, and Elizabeth Highfill defeated Early Thompson for Treasurer.

The following is the total unofficial vote cast in the county for the various candidates for office. The official count will be made this week by the county court and the MAIL will endeavor to give it in table form next week.

REPUBLICAN WINNERS

Roscoe C. Patterson defeated five opponents for the Republican nomination for U. S. Senator. Judge Henry S. Caulfield won the nomination for Governor with Phil A. Bennett his nearest rival. Charles U. Becker has over a two to one lead over Stephens for Secretary of State. Larry Brunk leads Steinbeck, his nearest competitor for State Treasurer on incomplete returns. Frank leads in the race for Judge of Supreme Court.

DEMOCRAT PRIMARY

In the Democratic race for state officers Hay won the nomination for U. S. Senator. Wilson was nominated for Governor.

Jones won the nomination from Lozier for Attorney-General with returns incomplete. Brown defeated O'Brien for Secretary of State.

Smith won the race for the nomination for State Auditor. Nacy was nominated for State Treasurer. Harris has the lead for the nomination for Lieutenant-Governor.
